Humility

Today's readings praise the virtue of humility and offer concrete ways for us to become more humble. The Book of Sirach suggests a practical reason for acting with humility: humble people are more likeable than the arrogant. Even God "finds favor" with those who humble themselves. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus provides real-world suggestions for growing in humility and teaches us never to assume we are better than others. His words change our outward behavior and expand our hearts and minds to care about people we might have dismissed before. This practical, almost "folksy" wisdom about humility helps us behave better in daily life and makes our lofty goal of eternal life more accessible. Our reading from Hebrews affirms that heaven is indeed approachable. The personal love and sacrifice of Jesus have opened "the city of the living God" to us. Humility prepares us for paradise.

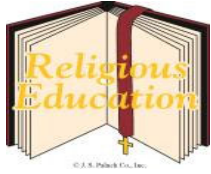
What are the First Friday and First Saturday Devotions?

Have you ever heard the terms "First Friday" and "First Saturday" thrown around in Catholic circles, without knowing why there was something special about these particular days at the start of each month?

The First Friday devotion and the First Saturday devotion are both reparatory devotions in the Catholic Church that arose from separate private revelations. The First Friday devotion is associated with the **Sacred Heart of Jesus**. The First Saturday devotion is associated with the **Immaculate Heart of Mary**. Incidentally, these are two of the most widely popular devotions to Jesus and Mary.

Both devotions involve receiving Holy Communion on a certain number of consecutive first Fridays (9) or first Saturdays (5) of the month. You can think of it almost like a novena which is prayed on consecutive days for a particular intention, but instead, these devotions are performed on consecutive months for the particular intention of reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, respectively.

The devotions are similar in that they call on the faithful to "stand in the gap" by doing penance for sinners, and both give a special promise of Divine assistance at the hour of death, that is, the promise of dying in a state of grace and therefore obtaining heaven.

LA HUMILDAD

Incluso Dios “encuentra gracia” con quienes se hacen pequeños. En el Evangelio de Lucas, Jesús ofrece sugerencias de la vida real para crecer en humildad y nos enseña a nunca asumir que somos mejores que los demás. Sus palabras cambian nuestro comportamiento exterior y expanden nuestros corazones y mentes para que cuidemos por las personas que antes habíamos desestimado. Esta sabiduría práctica, casi “popular”, sobre la humildad nos enseña a comportarnos mejor en la vida diaria y hace más accesible nuestra meta noble de la vida eterna.
